The tennis club has also been put to excellent use by the experts working with us, further improving the quality of our in-school provision for our children.</p> <p>We have many new sporting after-school clubs run by our teachers, which are extremely well attended by our children. 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already been used to transport our children to local sporting fixtures and swimming. The minibuses have also been planned in to transport our children to the outdoor and adventurous residential trips we currently run for our Year 5 children. They will enable us to keep the costs of our trips as low as possible for our parents and ensure a high number of pupils take up the offer of our residential trips.

The expertise that we buy into the school continues to allow us to deliver a robust PE curriculum that will systematically develop the talents of our children and recognise when they have talents that need to be nurtured at a higher level.

As we grow from a first school to a primary school we have offered swimming to two year groups this year, indoor for them to 'catch up' All children made excellent progress in their swimming ability through out the year.
