

The Laurels – September 2020 T. Edwards

To be reviewed annually

It is accepted that interacting with animals is not appropriate for all children but for some it has the potential to provide many positive benefits. Any parent who does not want their child to interact with 'Zak' has been invited to write to the school and inform her of their wishes. There are no diseases associated with having Zak in school, as his vets will be responsible for vaccinations, including rabies and completing regular health checks and necessary treatment. Zak will also be insured. The risk assessment below is a working document and will be checked annually by key staff and the governing body.

			 If Zak does get loose the office staff or designated handler will call for support from Mr. Edwards or Miss Bull, who will come and put the dog back on his lead and in the Head's office

Zak will attend the vets regularly to make sure he is in good health. Flea treatment would be used in school if required. Zak is groomed every 8 weeks. All staff and pupils are required to wash their hands after contact with Zak Handlers will clear up faeces promptly and dispose of this safely - pupils are told to stay away. In nearest dog bin. Zak will not be taken anywhere near food preparation areas Bedding and other areas that Zak comes in contact will be disinfected if required. The dog's pen in the Head's office can be used to keep Zak safe and he will also roam free in the office.
