

## PE and sport 2021 - 2022

Since 2013, the Government has spent millions on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

The Sports Premium Grant is money provided directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools, which have the freedom to choose how they do this. Every school is given a lump sum and additional payments based on pupil numbers.

Funding has helped to raise the profile of PE and sport in school and also to encourage and develop active learning across the school. It has also provided opportunities for our own pupils (be it at festival or competitions) to compete against other children across the locality and town. Doing this work, the school has achieved the School Games Silver award in its first year of applying.



We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of physical activity and school sport. We are committed to using the School Games to try and engage those young people who haven't previously been active or represented our school and to try and ensure that all our students have a positive experience and want to try out new activities beyond school too in our community. We believe in the power of physical activity and school sport as a school and give opportunities to those young people that need it most either as a participant, leader, official or volunteer.

### **Principles**

- To promote a healthy lifestyle (including Active 30 mins), active for now and later life
- To encourage competitive attitude during PE lessons and School Sport.
- To develop the pupil's understanding of what skills are needed at different levels and to transfer across different sports/activities.
- To encourage an ethos of independent thinking and decision making in sport.
- To develop the desire to improve on performance and competition (individually and within teams).
- To develop an enjoyment of PE and physical activity.

### **Provision**

All children at The Laurels access 2 hours of curriculum PE and sport each week. Children attend school in PE kit on those days to make the most of this time.
